Allotments

The water supply to all allotment sites has been switched off for the winter. This helps protect the pipes from damage caused by freezing water and allows us time to check and carry out any necessary repairs.

Village Hall Sites

In conjunction with South Norfolk Council, we have been successful in achieving funding through the Pride in Place Community Grant. This funding, along with a contribution from the Parish Council, is being used to commission a feasibility study to look at the community facilities in the village and specifically the village hall and adjacent parks. We frequently receive correspondence about speeding around the village and in July 2023 we purchased a SAM2 sign (a vehicle activated sign that displays the speed of the approaching vehicle). We share the data from this sign with you on our website and Facebook page. The statistics from our local Speed Watch Group indicate that the SAM2 sign does encourage people to reduce their speed. Thank you to all the Speed Watch volunteers for collecting and sharing the data.

Despite the actions of us and the Speed Watch Group we still receive correspondence from our residents about vehicles speeding in the parish. At our last Parish Council meeting we discussed the speed of traffic between Long Lane and the village hall entrance and will be looking into the options available to us to improve the situation. Many thanks to our residents who came along to our meeting and raised the issue.
